PARKING

As a coach-friendly town, Shrewsbury offers two free coach parks located at opposite ends of the town. These long-stay options are ideal for tours looking to spend the day exploring what's on offer.

Frankwell Coach Park (SY3 8HQ)

Located near the Theatre Severn and just 300 metres from the Sabrina boat, the Frankwell coach park features 5 dedicated coach bays ideal for those looking to explore the west side of town.

Abbey Foregate Coach Park (SY2 6AE)

Located opposite the Shrewsbury Abbey, the Abbey Foregate coach park features 13 dedicated coach bays and is just a 5-minute walk from the Wyle Cop's street of independent stores.

Smithfield Road Bus Stop (SY1 1PG)

Located outside the Premier Inn, this bus stop is available to use for a maximum of 2 hours.
